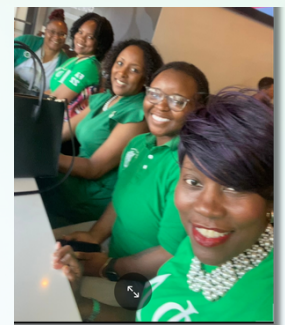

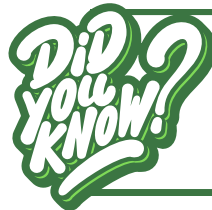


**September is Baby Safety Month!** It was introduced in 1983 by the Juvenile Products Manufacturers Association (JMPA) as Expectant Mother's Day. In 1986 it grew to be a weeklong celebration with Jayne Kennedy as the spokesperson in 1988. In 1991, it officially became a month. The internet allowed for baby safety information be more accessible and allowed JMPA to make their information downloadable. Throughout the 2010's JMPA continued to focus on educating parents and caregivers on safe sleeping practices and providing education/tool kits for parents and retailers. In 1985, every state passed a law requiring children to be strapped into a car seat. **September 17-23 is also Child Passenger Week.** Be sure to know the law for your state as many are required to be in a car seat/booster up to age 8 and/or weight requirements are to remain in the back seat until 12 or older. Did you know car seats had expiration dates? If there's no expiration date listed, a general rule of thumb is 6-7 years after date listed. ## COVID-19 Guideline Update

August 2023

The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) as well as the Department of Health & Human Services (DHHS) have consistent messaging that they are encouraging vaccinations and not going back to masking & vaccinations. **Here are the facts** According to data in the United States as of August 1, 2023, there is a slight and consistent rise in COVID-19 across the U.S. However, the CDC has repeatedly stated COVID-19 will become like the flu. It will sway back and forth depending on the seasonality of each geographic area.

To combat this ongoing virus, all agencies are recommending organizations, hospitals, schools etc. to be diligent and vigilant about **encouraging** everyone to be vaccinated as the data is showing vaccines do work. Correlating this to the flu, we know from data that when we do not take the flu vaccine, we have a higher chance of getting very sick if we get the flu. This is the exact same scenario with the Coronavirus infection. If we take our booster shots, even if we are exposed, we might experience slight symptoms for 24-48 hours, but the risk of hospitalization and potential death is significantly minimized.

### **GRADUATE AND UNDERGRADUATE CHAPTERS & AUXILIARIES MEETINGS & ACTIVITIES:**

Iota Phi Lambda Sorority shall as an organization practice safe and measured healthy meetings as well as activities for All in-person and public gatherings. It is recommended that meeting spaces be well-ventilated and ample spacing when at all possible. **Masks are optional as well.**

Undergraduate chapters shall follow the COVID-19 guidelines of their respective institutions as long as they are not in conflict with Iota Phi Lambda Sorority, Inc. guidelines. The same guidelines for Recruitment activities for Undergraduate chapters apply as previously mentioned. It is recommended that meeting spaces be well-ventilated and ample room for spacing when at all possible. **Masks are optional as well.**

Pelati, MOI and FIL will shall adhere to the same guidelines for meetings and activities as chapters. FIL sponsors are asked to have youth participate in areas that offer well-ventilated and ample spacing when at all possible. The reason being that most youth were not vaccinated for COVID and/or Flu. **Masks are optional as well.**

### **MEMBERSHIP RECRUITMENT: UNDERGRADUATE AND GRADUATE CHAPTERS**

Graduate Chapters will follow the same guidelines as used for regular meetings and activities. Undergraduate Chapters may follow the COVID-19 guidelines for recruitment at their respective institutions as long as it does not conflict with the guidelines established by Iota Phi Lambda Sorority, Inc.

Therefore, based on the scientific data and the recommendations from both agencies, it is recommended that Iota Phi Lambda Sorority, Inc. shall do the following:

- Encourage Sorors to stay up to date on their Covid-19 vaccines
- Encourage Sorors to stay up to date on their annual flu vaccines which begins in September (October for some states) 2023.
- For all Sorority sponsored events, we should use the honor code and continue to encourage and ask Sorors if they have been vaccinated. While this may be a strong stance, we must be considerate for each other's safety as well.

However, masking is not a mandatory requirement by the Sorority. Sorors may choose to "mask up" if so desired. It is a good practice to follow-up on any changes to COVID guidelines presented in your particular state or city health agencies for updates.

### **Centers for Disease Control Statement**

May 11, 2023, marked the end of the federal COVID-19 Public Health Epidemic - PHE declaration. After this date, the CDC's authorizations to collect certain types of public health data expired. The United States has mobilized and sustained a historic response to the COVID-19 pandemic. As a nation, we now find ourselves at a different point in the pandemic – with more tools and resources than ever before to better protect ourselves and our communities.

The information gathered for the COVID Policy was compiled from data collected from the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and the Department of Health & Human Service (DHHS). Soror Dr. Audrey Douglas Cooke, Eastern Regional Director provided the detailed recommendations and scientific data from her collaborations with these agencies.

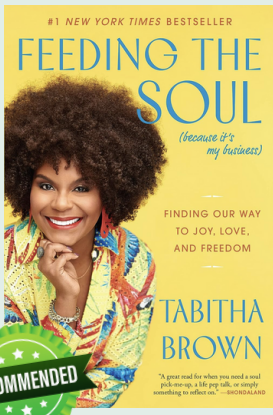

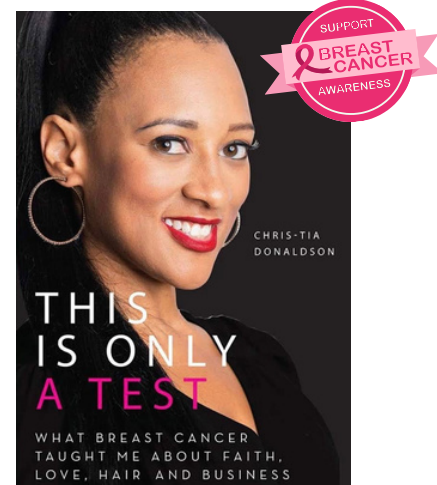


Tabitha grounds her lessons in stories about her own life, career, faith, and family in this funny, down-to-earth book, built around the catchphrases that her fans know and love.
